




Occupational Demand

Projected Occupational Demand

Between 2016 and 2021, medical assistants and medical secretaries are projected to increase 21 percent and 16 percent, respectively, in the San Diego-Imperial Region (Exhibit 1a).







Employers in the San Diego-Imperial region will need to annually hire 2,359 workers to fill new jobs and to backfill jobs due to attrition such as retirement or turnover (Exhibit 2).

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


