

Strategic Planning for SWP Round 2

(1) Adult education/noncredit
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identify pathways with high demand employment
(2) Curriculum alignment
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Select regional careers where curriculum can be aligned to meet skills gap • Align CTE curriculum with high school CTE curriculum across the region • Create regional programs of study and articulation agreements • Align matriculation process across 10 colleges.
(3) Digital badging: A visual representation of a skill or achievement (eg. Hard skill: coding; Soft skills: collaboration, participation; or Certification).
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identify a portable system that allows students to migrate between programs and colleges where appropriate.
(4) Early career exploration (post matriculation)
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide the opportunity for students to expand knowledge of careers. Help students use resources to gather information about careers that may be of interest based on increased self-awareness/self-knowledge. Expand the use of career assessments. • Provide mock interviews, guest speakers, career readiness training, job shadows, internships, mentorships, and more! • Develop an initial Career Action Plan in preparing for college or transition to college – Use various tools/resources to develop a plan with next steps.
(5) Employability skills
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Develop a short term career readiness certificate •employability skills
(6) Employer engagement
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Use technology to organize WBL • Promote productive partnerships between high school CTE programs, postsecondary educational institutions, emerging or growing regional businesses and industries, and labor organizations connected to those business and industries
(7) Middle/high school engagement (pre-matriculation)
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Evaluate effective CTE Pathways Program activities • Provide middle school “exploration” camps at our colleges focused on specific programs in a pathway • Provide career exploration for in-demand occupations • Bring students on to campus to expose them to colleges and careers. • Provide professional development to middle school/high school educators and community college faculty to improve their delivery of career-oriented academic and technical education.
