San Diego & Imperial County Strong Workforce Program College-Level Survey Results: San Diego Miramar College

The purpose of conducting work-based learning surveys was to establish the current status of work-based learning in the region to inform expansion and improvement efforts. Specifically, input was sought on the types of applied and work-based learning offered, ways that colleges and faculty implement applied and work-based learning and job placement, challenges faced, and needs for support. In addition, input on how 21st century skills and competencies are being taught was collected across the region. To address multiple perspectives, four surveys were created. Below is a brief description of each of the four surveys followed by links to **Miramar's** college-level raw survey data for each:

The **Applied and Work-Based Learning College Perspective Survey** sought perspectives from key staff involved in work-based learning and job placement who could provide the best college-wide perspective at each college. It was recommended that the people in the following roles complete this survey: Career Center director/coordinator; curriculum chairperson; counselor who could provide the best perspective on WBL at the college; cooperative work experience director/coordinator, and other key roles such as the director of experiential education.

The **Applied and Work-Based Learning Faculty Survey** sought to gather information about applied and work-based learning offered, ways that all types of faculty (both academic and career education) implement work-based learning and job placement, challenges faced, and needs for support across the colleges.

The **Inventory of Applied and Work-Based Learning Opportunities** sought to collect a comprehensive count of work-based learning and job placement offerings and participation levels at each campus.

The **21st Century Skills and Core Competency Faculty Survey** sought to establish a baseline regarding the core competencies being taught and how. It also invited faculty to share best practices for teaching core competencies and **21st century skills**.
