


#### Number of Jobs by Sector




#### 2010-2017 Employment Change


#### 2010-2017 Employment Change








#### Average Earnings Per Job, 2017

#### Appendix C – Middle-Skill Jobs


This study analyzes 298 middle-skill jobs.

Occupations that met the following minimum education requirements were included in the study:

- Some college coursework, a postsecondary certificate, and/or an associate degree; or
- High school diploma or equivalent with on-thejob training greater than 12 months; or
- Apprenticeship; or
- Bachelor's degree if at least 33 percent of workers in the occupation, age 25 or higher, have completed, as their highest level of education, some college coursework or an associate degree.


# Top 10 Middle-Skill Jobs by Annual Openings

San Diego County (2017-2022)





Imperial County (2017-2022)




# MSJs with Most Employment Growth in Sector (2017-2022)
