Dr. Star Rivera-Lacey continues her 25 years of progressive administrative and leadership community college experience as the new Superintendent/President of Palomar Community College District. Until her first official day as Superintendent/President, her extensive higher education experience was well grounded in leading Student Services and Instructional programming. Previously held positions include serving as the first Vice President of Student Services at the San Diego College of Continuing Education (SDCCE), and as the Assistant Superintendent/Vice President of Student Services at Palomar College.
